The School

James Madison High School is public high school for grades 9 to 12 in Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS) located in the town of Vienna, Virginia, ten miles west of the nation's capital.

Of a total enrollment of 2,099 students during 2023-24,

- 58.4% identify as White; 15.6% identify as Asian; 15.7% identify as Hispanic or Latino; 1.8% identify as Black; 8.5% identify with two or more races
- 5.7% receive English Learner Services
- 13.8% receive Special Education Services
- 12.8% meet qualifications for Free/Reduced-Priced Meals

JMHS students have the opportunity to participate in over 80 clubs/activities, including 19 VHSL Varsity Sports, Theatre, Band, Orchestra and Choir. Since Fall 2020, Madison students have:

- earned 13 VHSL State Championships (9 team; 4 individual)
- won the State Group-5 Marching Band Championship three times
- been selected for District XII Honor Choir, Band and Orchestra and All-State for Choir, Band and Orchestra

There are 524 students enrolled in the Class of 2025.

GPA & Class Rank

The GPA range for the current senior class is 1.568 to 4.596. FCPS does not rank students.

Through an annual survey of all seniors, the Class of 2024 reported the following postsecondary plan intentions:

- 9.5% Two-Year College
- 4.0% Employed
- 3.0% Career Education/Gap Year/Military/Other

Madison faculty have identified essential skills for mastery for all courses and student grades reflect their progress toward mastery of those skills during the course of the school year.

Grade point average (GPA) is calculated based on the basis of all high school courses for which credit has been earned, attempted, and previously awarded. High school courses taken in middle school may be expunged from the high school transcript. The parent or guardian must submit expungement requests within nine weeks of their child entering an FCPS high school.

<u>Additional Weighting for Advanced Academic Courses</u>: All Honors (HN) courses are weighted with an additional 0.5 quality points. Courses denoted as Advanced Placement (AP), Advanced (AV), Dual Enrollment (DE), or International Baccalaureate (IB) are weighted with an additional 1.0 quality points. FCPS does not rank students.

<u>During the 2020-21 school year</u>. FCPS utilized No Mark (NM) instead of F grades in all courses and students/families could choose a mark of 'P' (pass) instead of passing letter grades as their final mark in up to two high school classes.

FCPS supports an open enrollment policy regarding student access to Honors, AP and Dual Enrollment (DE) classes. Any student interested in taking these advanced courses may enroll in them.

In May 2024, 1,072 students took 2,796 AP tests with 78.8% passing with a score of 3 or higher.
