	Begin to finalize your list of colleges. Be prepared to share your list of colleges in the fall with your school counselor.
	Enter your list in Naviance, "Colleges I'm Thinking About"
<b>_</b>	Research colleges and complete college searches. Identify a broad range of colleges and their admission difficulty.
_	You want a balance and range of colleges you are planning to apply to.
	Consider NOVA or two-year college options; economically feasible, and helpful transition to a four-year college.
<b>_</b>	Look at application requirements and get organized to complete applications in the fall. College applications for 2025-2026 will be available by early to mid-August.
	<u>Common Application</u> and <u>Coalition Application</u> - Many colleges/universities participate in these application
