Students submit an application by a specified date and receive a decision in a clearly stated period of time.

Institutions review applications as they are submitted and render admission decisions throughout the admission cycle.

Students apply early and receive a decision well in advance of the institution's regular response date.

Students make a commitment to a first-choice institution where, if admitted they definitely will enroll and withdraw all other applications. The application deadline and decision deadline occur early.



The primary components of a completed college application include the student's application, high school transcript, test scores (if applicable), and recommendations.

Student determines need for recommendations (either teacher and/or counselor); some colleges do not require or read them.

Student should give their recommender(s) at least four weeks' notice.

Student should complete the required form(s)\* for either a counselor and/or teacher recommendation. Each teacher will have their own process for writing you a letter, so be sure to follow their guidelines.

#### **TRANSCRIPT**

Student requests high school transcript (which will be sent to the college directly by JMHS).

An FCPS Consent for Release of Student Records Form must be on file in order for JMHS to send official transcripts.

JMHS Transcript Request Form can be found on the JMHS website in the transcript section.

Student must request their transcripts at least 30 days prior to the college's application deadline.

It is the student's responsibility to monitor the status of their college applications, to make sure the college has received all materials. Check emails and the college's application portal.

#### **TEST SCORES (if applicable)**

Student requests their test scores directly from the testing agency (College Board or ACT).

The timeframe for score delivery to the colleges varies. Once colleges receive your scores, processing may take up to a week or so.

Many colleges are test optional. Check the individual college website for details.

## Writing Your College Essay

- ★ The best ideas come when you least expect it
- ★ Don't overthink the prompt. The questions are designed to spark
- ★ Write about experiences you care about. Don't tell a story you think ★ The essay content should fit YOU!
- ★ Write like you speak or are talking to your best friend, let your voice
- ★ There is no correct format (however, spelling and grammar
- ★ Ask yourself the HOW and WHY and tell about it

### The College Essay

How many college essays will I have to write?

- \* Will depend on the institution
- ★ Each institution will instruct you on how many essays they require
- ★ Often, it is possible to use an essay across multiple applications (or scholarship applications) with minor adjustments, depending on the prompts
- ★ If using Common App, you will write one longer essay (650 max word limit, 250 word minimum) as well as other supplemental essays (~250 words) that may be required at each institution
  - o Once you have added schools to your "My Colleges" tab in Common App. you will see which schools require the essay and which schools leave it as an optional writing prompt

#### Service Learning Hours | x2VOL

x2VOL is the tool that FCPS middle and high schools use to support students with finding, tracking, and verifying service hours electronically. Students login to x2VOL through this Naviance link.

- Students should track their hours in x2VOL
- ✓ Students are <u>able to earn a diploma</u> in the Commonwealth of Virginia <u>without completing service hours</u>
- ✓ 40 hours = black service learning cord to wear at graduation.
- ✓ 50 hours with additional criteria = apply for <u>The Board of Education's Seal of</u> Excellence in Civics Education
- ✓ 50 exclusive hours related to science service with additional criteria = apply for The Science & Environmental Seal
- Students who do not complete yearly service hours or who complete fewer than 40 hours over the course of high school will still be able to graduate
- Seniors must log their hours no later than April 25, 2025 to receive credit for the black service learning cord.
- ✓ Hours served after July 1 (prior to entering 9th grade) may be applied towards high school service learning hours.

#### Notes:

- When adding hours in x2VOL, if you are involved in a youth service organization such as, NCL, YMSL, JVL, Scouts, etc., <u>create ONE entry</u> for the total number of hours you are claiming. In the description you should list the dates, hours served, specific organization or project (if applicable) and any additional details. You may also add an attachment to your entry that details the information listed above.
- If you volunteer on a consistent basis at your church, a local non-profit or other organization, create ONE entry for the total number of hours you are claiming. In the description you should list the dates, hours served and any additional details. You may also add an attachment to your entry that details the information listed above.



- It is imperative that you PLAN AHEAD and follow the dates listed to the left. <u>Late requests risk not being sent by the deadline</u>.
- JMHS does not send standardized test scores to colleges. Students must request they be sent directly through College Board (www.collegeboard.org) or ACT (www.actstudent.org).
- Students must submit a request for every college to which they will apply, even if the college requires self-reported transcripts (Self-Reported Academic Record/SRAR). This form gives counselors permission to share information with colleges on your behalf, including senior year grades and a recommendation (if requested).
- JMHS will automatically send mid-year grade reports (semester grades)
  in early February to each college for which there is a request on file.





# SAT School Day | Wednesday, October 9, 2024

- FCPS will cover the cost of the SAT School Day for any twelfth-grade student who wishes to test on Wednesday, October 9, 2024.
- Seniors MUST register by September 4: <u>SAT School Day Intent to Participate Form</u> (must use an @fcpsschools.net email account to access and complete the form). Students and Parents/Guardians received an email from Mrs. Frate on August 13, 2024.
- Scores will be available to students on October 24 and electronic score reports will be available on October 30. However, if there are any delays with scores they will not be available for November 1 deadlines. Scores from students who test with accommodations are often delayed.
- Students can also sign up for a Saturday SAT directly through College Board.
   (Saturday October 5 Test Registration Deadline through CB is Sept 20)

FCPS reviews scholarship opportunities and publishes eligible ones in the Naviance scholarship database. Students and parents/quardians have access to Naviance and may view Scholarships and Enrichment Programs. Steps for how to view scholarships in Naviance available here.

#### School Based (JMHS) Scholarships for Seniors

These scholarships, once they become available, will be advertised to students with eligibility requirements, additional details and application due dates. These scholarships are based on the previous school year, please note that any changes will be reflected when the scholarship application is available for the current school year.


JMHS PTSA Making a Difference Scholarship: Three seniors will each receive a \$1,000 scholarship for "Making a Difference" (i.e. involvement at school, volunteer work, community service, paid work such as babysitting, helping their families, or other ways of enriching the lives of others). Seniors who plan to attend a two-year or four-year college or a professional/technical school. Essay (500 words or less) required explaining what you did to "Make a Difference" in the lives of others. Letter of recommendation also required.

JMHS Athletic Boosters Warhawk Pride Scholarship: Four \$1,000 scholarships will be presented to JMHS athletes who best exemplify Warhawk Pride. Scholarships will be awarded to four senior athletes. Athlete must be a current senior who plans to attend a two or four-year college or professional technical school. Any athlete receiving a full academic scholarship is not eligible. Minimum GPA of 2.5 through the first semester of senior year.

The Khristin Kyllo Dream Big Memorial Scholarship, Two \$5,000 scholarships are available for JMHS seniors who are planning to attend a four-year institution. The application requires a one page typed essay about yourself, life experiences and brief description of your financial need. Clearly write about how this scholarship would make a difference for your future education. This essay should focus on you and your situation.

The Lenny Schultz Scholarship will award a \$2,000 scholarship to a student planning to attend a two-year or four-year college, who has played football and/or wrestled or who has been a team manager for either of these two sports or any student in the special education program who has uplifted others in the community, school, or other involvements. The application requires a one page typed essay, resume, and a letter of recommendation.

Vienna Optimist Essay Contest: The Optimist Club of Greater Vienna sponsors an annual Essay Contest for high school students. Amount is \$1,000 with potential for up to \$2,500. Available for students in grades 9-12.

Vienna Optimist Clyde Rees and Paul Booze Vocational Scholarship, \$2,500: The Optimist Club of Greater Vienna sponsors a scholarship for students who plan to pursue an apprenticeship, trade or technical school or occupational field, such as, plumbing, auto mechanic, auto repair, carpenter, HVAC technician, electrician, cosmetologist, culinary arts practitioner/chef, etc..

Vienna Volunteer Fire Department Auxiliary Scholarship, \$1,000: Applicants must have been accepted at an accredited college, university or technical school. 500 word essay on the benefits of volunteering in a community.

Vienna Youth Soccer (VYS) Scholarship, \$2,500: http://vvs.org/offering-vvs-scholarships VYS will award two scholarships to high school seniors who have participated as players in the Club and plan to further their education at a college or university. Seniors who have demonstrated exceptional standards of sportsmanship, dedication, leadership, community service, and/or perseverance.

VHSL Savedge Award, \$500: https://www.vhsl.org/scholarships/ is awarded to a senior who has participated and excelled in school publications (magazines, newspapers, yearbooks) and for at least two years demonstrated outstanding personal qualities such as leadership, writing proficiency, design aptitude, creativity, teamwork, and character.

VHSL Vito Perriello Citizenship Award, \$1,000: https://www.vhsl.org/scholarships/ is awarded to a senior who has demonstrated outstanding traits of citizenship in their high school career. Student must have previously participated in one or more VHSL activities which can include serving as an athletic training student aide (ATSA) with a Virginia licensed athletic trainer within their high school.

Award amount is typically **\$1,000** with potential to receive more. From the applicant pool, JMHS may nominate one student to receive this award.

Federal Water Quality Association (Environmental or Engineering), \$2,000: Three scholarships will be awarded to graduating seniors who plan to pursue environmental careers.

Harry F. Byrd Leadership Award, \$20,000: Seniors who demonstrate a combination of accomplishment, excellence of character, qualities of leadership and good citizenship. If selected, a letter of recommendation is required to be written by the principal or school counselor. Each secondary school in Virginia may nominate one graduating senior for the Harry F. Reston Hospital Scholarship, \$1,000: Seniors who will pursue a career in a health care-related field: Medicine, nursing, physical therapy, etc. One senior will be selected for this award. Students must submit a resume of related experiences in health care, such as, volunteering, coursework, efforts, accomplishments, research, etc. that you have been involved with. Only include items on your resume that are related to your efforts in health care. Be sure to include where you will be attending college and the major you will pursue. Students must also submit a brief statement about why you chose the field of study (not an essay, just one paragraph.) From the applicant pool, JMHS will forward selected nominee to the sponsor.

W. Harold Ford Scholarship Foundation, Teaching Scholarship, \$2,000: This is a local scholarship for students with at least at 2.7 GPA who plan to attend a four-year college that offers a teacher education/certification program, major in education and plan to teach after college graduation. From the completed applicant pool, two JMHS student applications will be selected and submitted to the sponsor. Visit http://www.fcre.org/scholarship.html for details.

#### **FCPS Facilitated Scholarships**

These scholarships are typically submitted to the JMHS College & Career Center.

From the applicant gool, JMHS will forward selected nominees to FCPS for consideration.

**Emily and Fred Ruffing ACCA Scholarship, \$2,000 per semester/renewable:** This is a renewable, per semester, award. Available to a senior with a disability and academic achievement. Must plan to attend college full time. JMHS will submit all applications to FCPS.

**Granville P. Meade, \$2,000/renewable:** This is a renewable award for "worthy and needy" students going to a Virginia college or university. An undisclosed number of awards are available to VA seniors who are financially unable to attend college. Must attend a VA public or private college and be a VA resident. JMHS will submit all applications to FCPS.

**Laura Ashley Piper Scholarship, \$1,000**: Demonstrated integrity, leadership, service to school and community, academic excellence, athletic merit. JMHS will submit one application to FCPS.

**Michell Merhige, \$1,500:** Provide recognition and financial assistance to a FCPS graduating senior who demonstrates academic strength and potential, an ability to overcome adversity and a financial need. Priority will be given to those who have experienced homelessness, been in foster care or lacked substantial family support. JMHS will submit all applications to FCPS.

**Vulcan Materials Scholarship, \$2,000/renewable:** Student has resided in Northern Virginia at least four years prior to nomination, U.S. Citizen, academic accomplishment and ability, extra-curricular activities, financial need. Preference will be given to applicants who plan to attend college in Virginia. JMHS will submit all applications to FCPS.

William J. Foreman Memorial Scholarship, up to \$2,000: Recipients for the William J. Foreman Memorial Scholarship must currently be classified as homeless, or an unaccompanied youth and meet the eligibility criteria established by the donor of the scholarship as follows: Academic merit, school involvement, financial need, work experiences, attendance, life experiences, leadership or mentoring. JMHS will submit all applicantions to FCPS.

From the applicant pool, two JMHS students will be selected to be forwarded onto the Jefferson Scholars Foundation.

Virginia Tech Pamplin Leadership Award: A one-year, merit-based \$5,000 Virginia Tech tuition scholarship. The scholarship is open to students applying to all majors. Pamplin Leaders are students who demonstrate superior intellectual promise and academic performance, dedication to their communities, interest and success in physical fitness and health, and unimpeachable integrity. Students who accept this award must also agree to join the University Honors and work toward an honors diploma.






